MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 30, 2022 ANNUAL PARISH MEETING OF

ST. CHRISTOPHER'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH

HELD BY PHONE-IN TELECONFERENCE/ZOOM APP AND FACEBOOK

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting opened with Deacon Perry Pauley stating that the count for attendance on Zoom and on Facebook was 58 which constituted a quorum. He convened the meeting at 11:45 a.m. with prayer.

PRESENTATION OF THE 2020 ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES: Beth asked everyone to take a few minutes to review the minutes of the 2020 meeting as presented in the annual report. There being no comments or question, Bonnie Franco made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, John Card seconded. All approved.

BISHOP'S VICAR FOR ST. CHRISTOPHER'S CHURCH REMARKS: Deacon Perry Pauley stated how much we love and miss Fr. Peter who passed away in August. With his loss and the pandemic, this year was very challenging but noted St. Christopher's was strong and resilient. We are still doing God's work even though we are not meeting on the church campus. In 2021 we are going to continue to stay connected with each other. Plans are for a community food bank drive, and the development of a new Creation of Care team. It has been an honor and privilege to be a deacon in this amazing parish. He also noted that 2021 will be St. Christopher's 60th anniversary and plans are being made to celebrate in July.

SENIOR WARDEN REPORT: Beth Mayhew thanked Dn. Perry for all his work for stepping in to help us continue and move forward while he is finishing his seminarian studies. She also thanked Doreen Rohrer, the Parish Administrator, and the people who helped with the phone tree and the check in of the campus. She announced that the Search Committee is ready to go forward in the search process.

Budget Narrative 2022

Treasurer's Report/2023 Approved Budget:

- Summit Roofing replaced the roof on the main church building at a cost of \$27,030.00. The money was taken from the CARES Fund, which was dissolved, The Capitol Acct, and the Building Fund.
- The Chapel Doors were replaced, due to vandalism, at a cost of \$6179.68 which was submitted to the insurance company and reimbursed.
- Changed from Wells Fargo Bank to Chase Bank.

- Our income was \$4,555.00 below our budget, and our expenses were \$39,589.00 below our budget, mostly due to our Clergy costs being approximately \$32,095.00 below budget, so, we had an Operating deficit of \$3,217.00.
- The solar was not working properly for about 6 weeks, which caused an increase in our electric costs for 2022. We were \$2,000.00 over budget. The issue has been corrected and is being monitored by several members more closely going forward.

Highlights for 2023:

- We anticipate our income to be down about \$22,649 from 2022 actual.
- We anticipate our expenses to be up by about \$36,878.00 from 2022 actual.
- We anticipate a deficit of about \$62,746.00 in 2023.
- We are always trying to think of new ways to raise funds and are open to suggestions for fundraising.
- As always, thank you for your support.

Interim Rectors Report...

Dear friends,

To say I didn't expect to be here at this point might be the understatement of the century. But what a blessing it has been — for the most part. Insert wry smile here.

We started the year regrouping, reformulating and rebranding in order to get ready to once again publish your church profile in order to attract qualified candidates to lead St.

Christopher's into the future. Sadly, that search didn't produce a match. I know many were disappointed and disheartened by this seeming failure. But, like I said at the time, the good news is the process worked — no matter how laborious. I have seen the disasters of calling the wrong person just to get the process over and done with. Patience is the key. And, prayer from everyone is necessary. I pray every day that your new pastor will rise to the top of the candidate pool with this next search. Currently, your profile is active and open to accept applicants. It really is exciting to see what the future holds. Your pastor is still out there.

In the meantime, St. Christopher's is coming alive again as a community in Christ. In my view, the activity that set the tone for the year was the Men's Club hosting the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. The mood of the room was amazing. I think it was because it was really the first social time we had all been back together. Thank you to the Men's Club for leading us back into normalcy where good fellowship and food bring friends together in the name of Christ.

Next of course, was Ash Wednesday which kicked off Lent. And, during this penitent season, we hosted a bible & book study which included a soup supper after each meeting. We also invited Carol Wills into our community to lead education for children and adults. She prepared six for baptism as well as six for reception and confirmation into our Christian community. We celebrated this milestone during the Easter Vigil which was a wonderful worship service. And through this process four of our members were received and confirmed at diocesan service during the Easter season. We will be hosting the same education program this year. If you know of anyone desiring baptism, confirmation or reception, please encourage them to contact me as soon as possible.

St. Christopher's was blessed when Carol chose to stay in our community to lead our youngest members in a Sunday School program called Sycamore Tree. They meet during the sermon time of the 9:30 service for 20 to 25 minutes where they discuss the day's readings in terms that are more appropriate to their age. Carol has hosted as many as seven children during this activity. And from this group, we got our Christmas Eve play where all ages participated and Frank Schlitching played THREE KINGS! Just so you know, Carol won't accept a salary for the work she does here, but we have included a small amount in this year's budget for Children's programs to be sure she has the tools she needs for as long as she is here.

Summer brought hot months but also movie afternoons in Harte Hall where sometimes as many as 15 people came to watch the popular internet show, "The Chosen" on Tuesdays where snacks and often ice cream sundaes were seen. I have no idea if I will be here this summer, but I think the activity is worthy of our time again. Let us know if there's a movie you might suggest for the "dog days of summer" 2023. Preliminary planning will begin soon.

I don't remember when it started, but "Jam Session" became a reality at St. Christopher's. A group of musicians gather in Harte Hall every Wednesday following the Healing & Holy Eucharist Service to play music together. We've got guitars, a banjo and the occasional piano accompaniment. Music is sometimes worshipful, but more often than not the melodious tunes are reminiscent of days gone by — representing the 50s, 60s and occasionally 70s. The group welcomes any and all musicians,

vocalists and those who want to be vocal. No matter what your instrument — if you play a mean set of spoons, stop by because I know the percussion will be welcomed.

Sadly, I had to help St. Christopher's say goodbye to several members who through death went onto their eternal destinations. That is one of the hardest things I've had to do because I have grown to love you all. It's so difficult to say those last goodbyes even knowing that the journey of our loved ones is really just beginning with Jesus Christ.

We saw the return of the Christmas crafts & bake sale — officially named St. Christopher's Christmas Bazaar and Bake Sale. The decision was made to host this event in September but even with the late start, it was determined to be a great success — and it rained. We hosted four outside vendors who enjoyed their time here so much they all said they want to return next year. A special thanks to Marie Vogel and Barbara Jackson for coordinating this event and committing to next year as well. Stay tuned for announcements when crafting will begin for the 2023 event.

This year, we celebrated "the Hanging of the Greens," a first time service for this community. We were late celebrating due to a variety of scheduling conflicts, and although it didn't go as planned which resulted in a lot of laughter, I think it might survive as a tradition. There were people standing on ladders and pews that caused me to wonder that if anyone fell how in the world I was going to explain to the EMS personnel when they arrived. Happily, no injuries were sustained and everyone did seem to have a wonderful time. This wouldn't have been possible without the help of Bonnie and Al Franco riding herd on everything that needed to be gathered and put in place.

I couldn't submit an annual report without mentioning my friends from the Spanish language service. They have spent the last year being so patient with me as I have learned to read their language. As I read within my limited scope, I'm learning to understand a little more. Not much, mind you but I think we have developed a close relationship with each other. That allows me to be more confident than my skills actually reveal which opens the doors for taking chances as we learn how to communicate with each other. This has been my greatest challenge and my greatest joy. Every hug empowers me to try harder. I couldn't have done what I've done or forged the relationships I now cherish without the help of Beth Mayhew and Bill Lynn. Beth coordinates all the service activities: scheduling worship servers, creating the weekly service bulletin and keeping in touch with everyone during the week. And, Bill is in my office every Wednesday to help me read through the service so that, hopefully, my pronunciation improves.

St. Christopher's has been blessed with several new families joining our community this AND getting involved. This is truly a sign of good times to come. True growth happens slowly; it comes through word of mouth: members telling friends and family about their experiences and what that means to them; through outreach into the communities as well as inviting the public onto the campus through Bargains and the Bookstore. We couldn't ask for better ambassadors than the volunteer staff serving the public led by Carol & Bill Masters as well as Charlotte Powley.

In closing, I have no idea how long I will be with my friends at St. Christopher's. I've decided to quit trying predict. I will just say that for however long we are together, I plan to make the most of it — in the name of Christ. I hope you will join me on this part of St. Christopher's journey into the future.

Senior Warden’s Report...

At the Annual Meeting in January we elected new Vestry members: Jim Barnette, Sallie Crill, Marie Dunkelbarger, Gordon Lindvall, and Marie Vogel. Continuing members were Bill Lynn and Margie Martinez. Bonnie Franco was voted our Junior Warden. Kelly Thomas became Treasurer, and Jane Cooley served as Clerk.

During the first six months, Vestry members presented the chapters of the Vestry Resource Guide which provided valuable information on Vestry's responsibilities and functions. In May, some Vestry and Search members collaborated to update our parish profile. Search re-opened to receive names May 10 –July 8. Search reviewed candidates' packets and interviewed 3 candidates by Zoom. They forwarded to Vestry their approved candidate who interviewed at St Christopher's Aug 30 – Sep 1. Bishop Reddall extended Vestry's offer to the candidate who ultimately did not agree to all items.

Bishop Reddall's regular visit happened on October 2. She celebrated at both English and Spanish services. Following that she met with the Vestry. She suggested our next step for Search was to have parishioners complete the online Congregational Vitality Assessment (CVA). Parishioners, including Vestry, completed 41 assessments. Canon Braden, Canon to the Ordinary, partially reviewed results with Vestry. On November 12, Canon Braden led our Day of Discovery with 42 people attending. On November 14, Canon Braden addressed the Vestry via Zoom. She clarified some questions she'd received from parishioners. (For a copy of the CVA results or for details on information discussed during the Day of Discovery, please ask any Vestry member.)

This year Vestry also served as our Stewardship Committee for the first time. Our campaign began on November 27, and in-gathering of pledges for 2023 was on December 11. We continue to gather pledges. Please contact any Vestry member if you would like to pledge or if you have questions.

As your Senior Warden, I'd like to thank all Vestry members for their hard work, especially Bonnie Franco, Junior Warden. It's a privilege to serve as your Senior Warden, with God's help.

El reporte de 2022 de la junta parroquial por la Guardián Mayor

En la reunión anual de enero, elegimos nuevos miembros de la junta parroquial: Jim Barnette, Sallie Crill, Marie Dunkelbarger, Gordon Lindvall y Marie Vogel. Los miembros que continuaron fueron Bill Lynn y Margie Martinez. Bonnie Franco fue votada como nuestra Guardián Menor. Kelly Thomas se convirtió en Tesorera y Jane Cooley se desempeñó como Secretaria.

Durante los primeros seis meses, los miembros de la junta parroquial presentaron los capítulos de la Guía de Recursos de la Junta Parroquial que proporcionó información valiosa sobre las responsabilidades y funciones de la Junta Parroquial. En mayo, algunos miembros de la Junta Parroquial y de la Búsqueda colaboraron para actualizar el perfil de nuestra parroquia. La búsqueda empezó de nuevo a recibir nombres del 10 de mayo al 8 de julio. El comité revisó los paquetes de los candidatos y entrevistó a 3 candidatos por Zoom. Enviaron a la junta parroquial a su candidato aprobado que se entrevistó en San Cristóbal del 30 de agosto al 1o de septiembre. La obispo Reddall extendió la oferta de la junta parroquial al candidato quien finalmente no estuvo de acuerdo con todos los requisitos.

La visita regular del obispo Reddall ocurrió el 2 de octubre. Ella celebró en las misas en inglés y español. A continuación se reunió con la junta parroquial. Sugirió que nuestro siguiente paso para la búsqueda era que los feligreses completaran la Evaluación de Vitalidad Congregacional (CVA) en línea. Los feligreses, incluida la junta parroquial, completaron 41 evaluaciones. Canóniga Braden, Canóniga a lo Ordinario, revisó parcialmente los resultados con la junta parroquial. El 12 de noviembre, ella dirigió nuestro Día del

Descubrimiento con la asistencia de 42 personas. El 14 de noviembre, Canóniga Braden se dirigió a la Junta Parroquial a través de Zoom. Aclaró algunas preguntas que había recibido de los feligreses. (Para obtener una copia de los resultados de CVA o para obtener detalles sobre la información discutida durante el Día del Descubrimiento, pregúntele a cualquier miembro de la Junta Parroquial).

Este año, la Junta Parroquial también se desempeñó como nuestro Comité para la Mayordomía por primera vez. Nuestra campaña comenzó el 27 de noviembre y la recolección de promesas para 2023 fue el 11 de diciembre. Seguimos recolectando promesas. Comuníquese con cualquier miembro de la junta parroquial si desea comprometerse o si tiene preguntas.

Como su Guardián Mayor, me gustaría agradecer a todos los miembros de la junta parroquial por su arduo trabajo, especialmente a Bonnie Franco, Guardián Menor. Es un privilegio servir como su Guardián Mayor con la ayuda de Dios.

Search Committee Report

Our Search Committee worked diligently. In collaboration with some Vestry members, we updated our parish profile before our documents were posted on the national database. We also had an ad in the Episcopal News Service. Interested clergy sent their packets to Canon Braden, our Canon to the Ordinary, who did an initial

background check before forwarding the eligible packets to us. July 8 was the closing date for candidates to submit their information. We then prayerfully and carefully reviewed their packets, created interview questions, as well as reference check questions. We initially had three qualified candidates. We interviewed each by Zoom. One candidate stopped at this point, and we moved forward with the two others. Shortly after passing their packets to Vestry, one candidate decided not to continue. Vestry did an in-person interview with our final candidate at Christopher's. Ultimately, this candidate didn't accept Vestry's offer.

When Bishop Reddall visited she suggested that the parish complete a Congregational Vitality Assessment. Once this was completed Canon Braden led our Day of Discovery. With this additional information, we reviewed our parish profile and noted that the parish's criteria were essentially unchanged. Some of our committee members were unable to continue. As we re-open our search and accept candidates in 2023, our committee members will be Clive Chancey, Patty Emanuelson, Bonnie Franco, Wilma Hammond, Beth Mayhew (Chair), Diane Plein, Maria Salgado and Dick Young. Please continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to guide us to finding a faithful pastor who will care for us and guide us into St Christopher's next chapter.

Reporte para 2022 del Comité de Búsqueda

Nuestro Comité de Búsqueda trabajó diligentemente. En colaboración con algunos miembros de la junta parroquial, actualizamos el perfil de nuestra parroquia antes de que nuestros documentos se publicaran en la base de datos nacional. También tuvimos un anuncio en Servicio Episcopal de Noticias. El clero interesado envió sus paquetes a Canóniga Braden, nuestra Canóniga del Ordinario, quien realizó una verificación inicial de antecedentes antes de enviarnos los paquetes elegibles. El 8 de julio fue la fecha límite para que los candidatos enviaran su información. Luego, en oración y con cuidado, revisamos sus paquetes, creamos preguntas para la entrevista, así como preguntas para verificar las referencias. Inicialmente teníamos tres candidatos calificados. Entrevistamos a cada uno por Zoom. Un candidato se detuvo en este punto y seguimos adelante con los otros dos. Junior Warden

I was elected as the Junior Warden in August of 2021 with the mutual understanding I would serve temporarily for an interim of time based on my ability and effectiveness. The Bookshelf by Charlotte Powley

In 2006, the bookstore started with one bookcase in what is now the library. As books and bookcases were donated to our store, we expanded and moved into Harte Hall. Last year we were sorry to lose our leader, Jane Meyers. Diane Neverman has agreed to step in and take her place. Stay healthy, Diane.

In our fiction section, the books are arranged alphabetically by author. All of the people working in the bookstore are book lovers so if you cannot find your favorite author, an alternate who writes in the same style can generally be suggested by one of our bookies. This has led people to find new sources and we try to suggest authors who have written a lot of books. It's like finding a new friend.

Our nonfiction section is sorted into different categories to make it easier for you to find the book you need. As expected in a church bookstore we have a large selection of spiritual and religious books, mental health and bibles of different vintages. The old ones are the best because they have been prayed over. We have several shelves of biographies, political books, sports, humor, verse and Spanish books. Some of our best sellers are the cookbooks and the books on nutrition and health. We have DVD movie tapes, music tapes and CDs. Jigsaw puzzles are our really big sellers.

Our children's area is outgrowing its location so that is always being expanded. What would we rather see in our children's hands than a book?

We have a theme table which is changed at irregular intervals.

The bookstore has never had any expenses. Everything has been donated including the bookcases. Prices are kept very low to stimulate circulation and we have been able to generate to the general fund, several thousand dollars over the years of our life.

We are very grateful to our loyal helpers – John & Linda, Amy, Sue and all the Saturday volunteers who help us sell the books.

On our wish list we would like more Westerns, more paperbacks and more book lovers. The bookstore is open to the community every Saturday morning 8am to 12 noon, so we see a lot of our neighbors and friends who attend different churches.

St. Christophers Christmas Bazaar and Bake Sale

The Christmas Bazaar and Bake Sale was a wonderful success and resulted in nearly \$1200 in sales...in spite of the unexpected rain. Annual report 2022

During the past year as we began to return to our temporary normal, a new Columbarium Committee has been formed, as described in the Columbarium policy.

Barbara Welsh, Charlotte Powley and Gordie Lindvall are committee members, overseen by the Junior Warden Bonnie Franco.

In this past year, many days and hours have been spent reconciling records, maps, policies and verifying data. All current data is now stored on the church office computer and maintained by collaboration between committee members and the Administrative Assistant.

The vestry approved an updated policy and revised forms to be used as niches are purchased.

The current numbers are as follows. Our Columbarium contains 180 niches, 125 are currently occupied, 11 are paid in full and reserved for future use, and 44 remain available. Each niche costs \$500 and includes interment, maintenance, and all future needs at no additional costs.

2022 Search Committee Report

Our Search Committee worked diligently. In collaboration with some Vestry members, we updated our parish profile before our documents were posted on the national database. We also had an ad in the Episcopal News Service. Interested clergy sent their packets to Canon Braden, our Canon to the Ordinary, who did an initial background check before forwarding the eligible packets to us. July 8 was the closing date for candidates to submit their information. We then prayerfully and carefully reviewed their packets, created interview questions, as well as reference check questions. We initially had three qualified candidates. We interviewed each by Zoom. One candidate stopped at this point, and we moved forward with the two others. Shortly after passing their packets to Vestry, one candidate decided not to continue. Vestry did an in-person interview with our final candidate at Christopher's.
